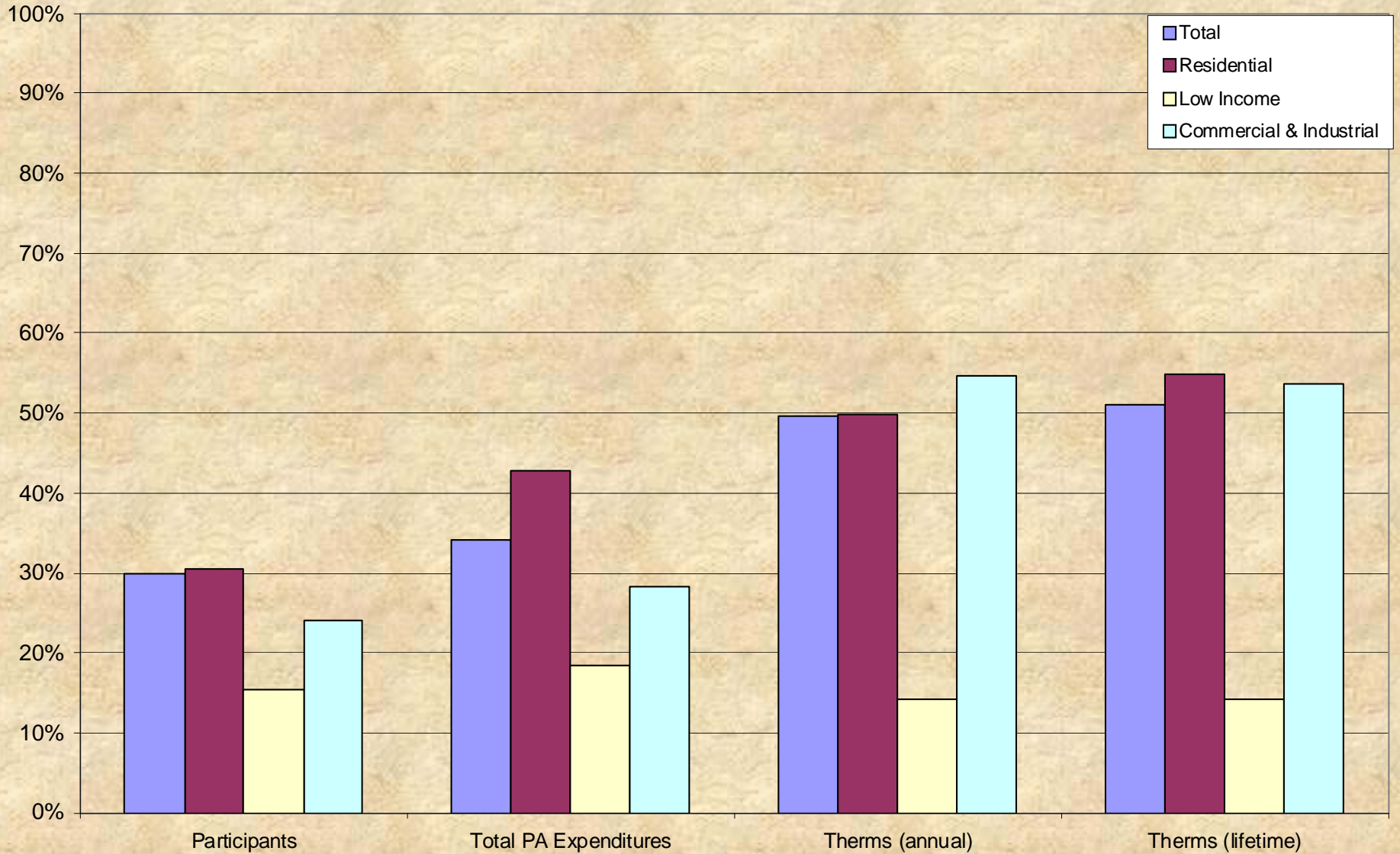

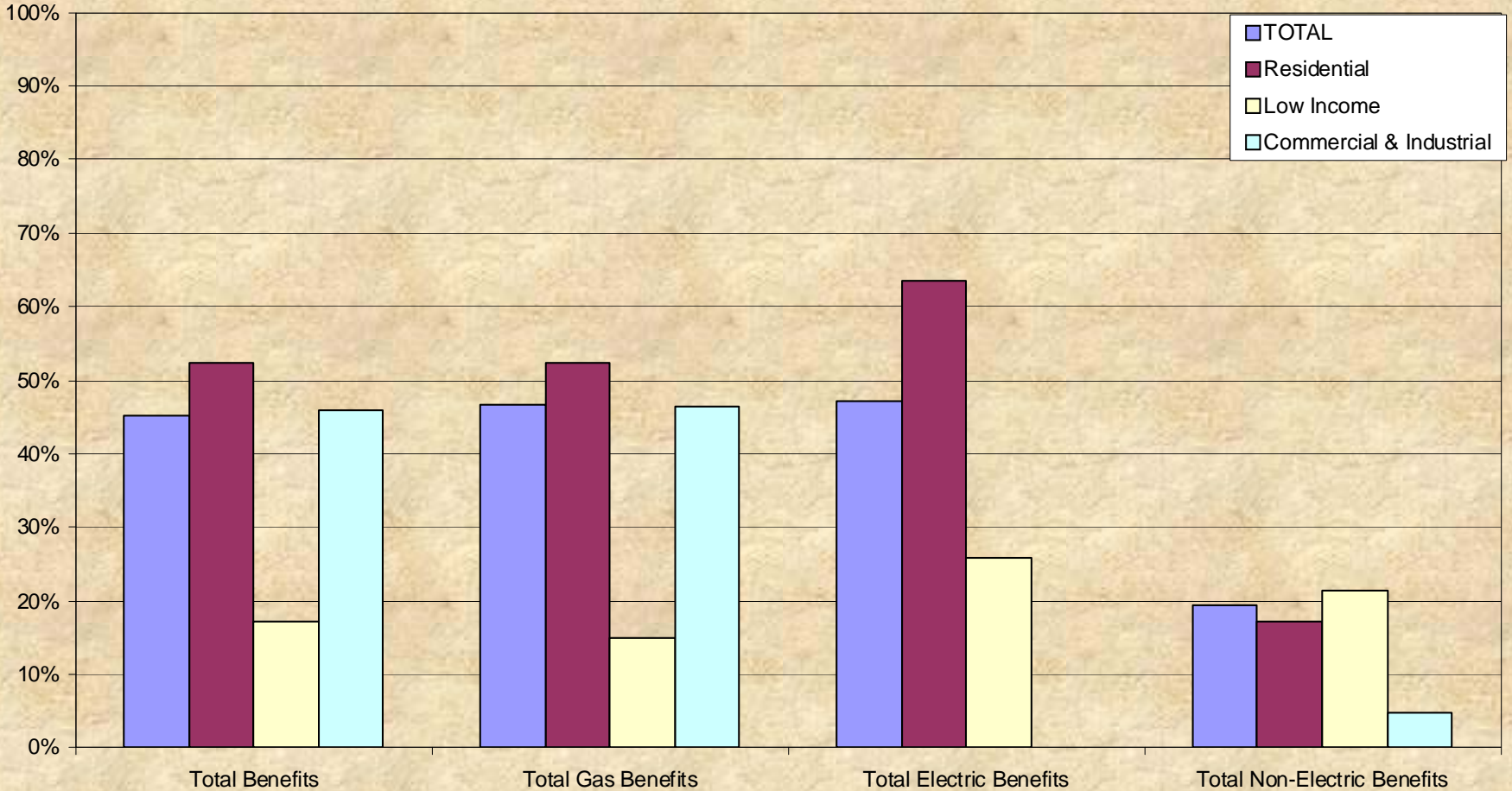

YTD Preliminary Actuals as a Percent of Plan Goal



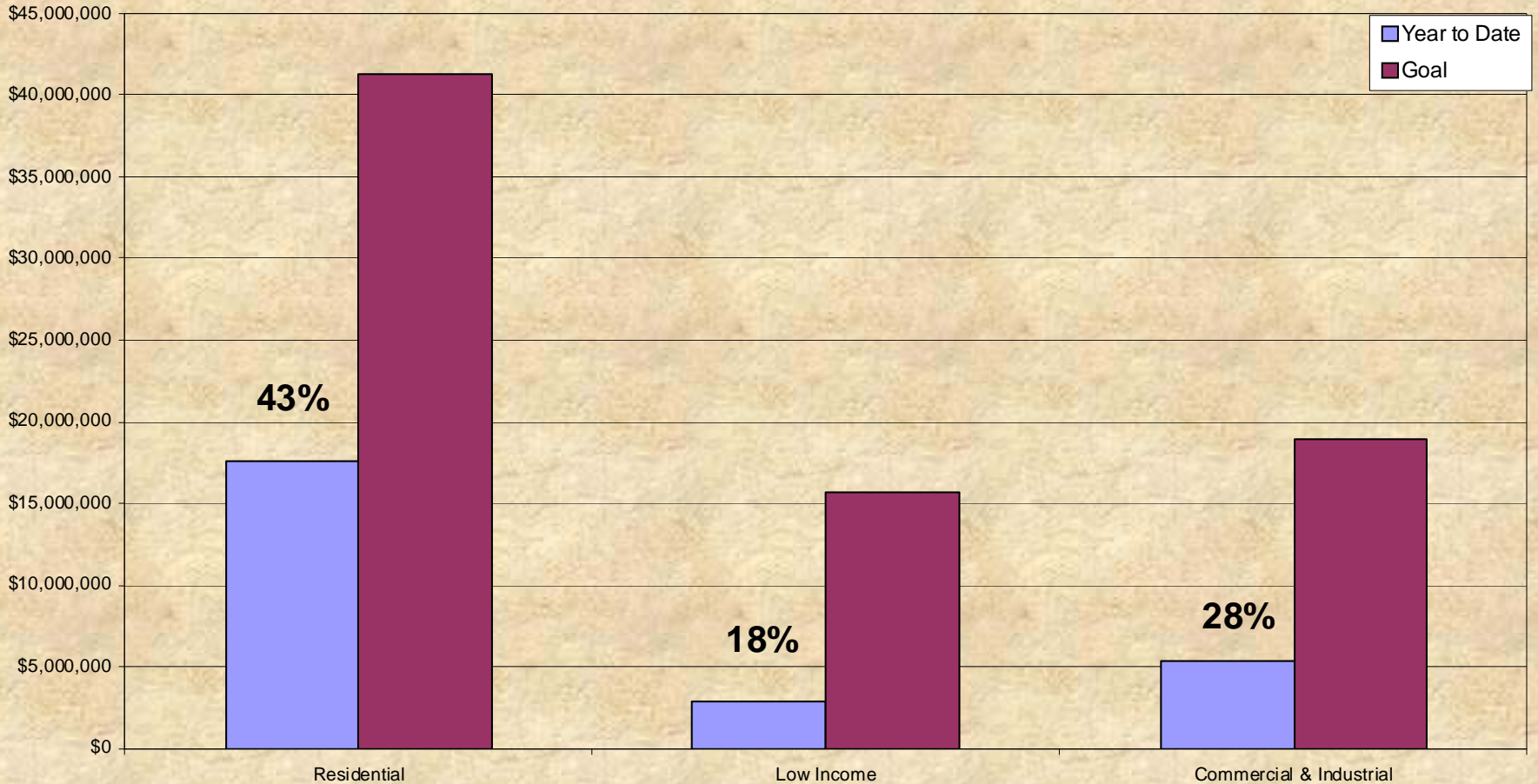
